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Barbados Marine Spatial Plan

The Barbados Marine Spatial Plan ("Barbados MSP") speaks to the evidence-based, participatory zoning of Barbados' marine space as well as the requisite administrative and legal arrangements to achieve long-term sustainable ocean management. It is administered by the Marine Spatial Planning Unit (MSP Unit), which is a division of the Coastal Zone Management Unit (CZMU) of the Ministry of Environment and National Beautification, Green and Blue Economy as the MSP authority in Barbados. The Barbados MSP is being developed in partnership with the University of the West Indies Cave Hill and The Nature Conservancy, and with the financial and technical support of the InterAmerican Development Bank, to encourage sustainable national socio-economic development, promote cooperation and reduce conflicts between users.
