# BARBADOS ADVANCES OCEAN PLANNING WITH NATURAL CAPITAL ACCOUNTING **WORKSHOP**



At the end of June. Barbados hosted a successful Natural Capital Accounting Workshop at the Caribbean Development Bank, bringing together government ministries, technical experts, and regional partners to strengthen how the island measures the value of its marine and coastal ecosystems. Organised by the Marine Spatial Planning Unit (MSPU) with the support of the Coastal Zone Management Unit (CZMU), eftec (UK-based environmental economics firm) and the Blue Marine Foundation, the workshop introduced the UN SEEA-EA framework to help Barbados better understand and include nature's benefits—like coral reefs, fisheries, and beaches—into national planning.



Dr. Leo Brewster, Director of the CZMU, explained that this work directly supports the Marine Spatial Planning process now underway, providing the evidence Barbados needs to balance conservation with economic opportunity. "By quantifying these services, we can make smarter, sustainable decisions about how our marine space is used now and in the future," he said.

## LET'S SET SAIL!

We are delighted to announce that Barbados is set to launch its first-ever bathymetric survey in the coming days through a new partnership with the Marine Institute of Ireland. Just a few weeks ago, the visiting team from Ireland journeyed to Barbados to officially sign the vessel agreement and begin planning the logistics for this milestone project.

The deep-sea survey will be the island's first to map the seafloor and study the water columns in the outer reaches of Barbados' Exclusive Economic Zone, providing crucial data to inform the Marine Spatial Plan and guide the sustainable use of our marine resources.
